

October 14, 2010

The Paupack Township Board of Supervisors met on the above date at 7:30 P.M. at the Municipal building. The minutes of the September 9th meeting were approved by Leigh Gilbert and seconded by Tom Oakley.

A Treasurer's report was given. Leigh Gilbert made a motion to accept the report seconded by Tom Oakley – vote unanimous.

A review of the bills was made. After clarification on a bill from Precision Industries, Tom Oakley made a motion to approve the bills seconded by Leigh Gilbert – vote unanimous.

Tom announced a permit was issued for Big Bear Campground. However a decision has not been made by the Dime Bank for a loan. There has not been any cost estimates or projections presented.

Tom Oakley made a motion to advertise the Supervisors November meeting to be held on November 10, 2010 due to the Veterans Day holiday on November 11th seconded by Leigh Gilbert – vote unanimous.

Tom Oakley made a motion for a Conditional Use hearing on New Wave to be held on November 10, 2010 at 7:00 P.M. and for the Secretary to advertise in the legal ads, seconded by Leigh Gilbert – vote unanimous. The Planning Commission will have their recommendations ready for the Supervisors.

The food pantry will be held on October 28th from 11:00 until 2:00 P.M.

Tom announced that Wayco, Inc. has redone Crane and Peifer Roads. The job was found to be satisfactory by the supervisors. A letter will be sent to the bonding company indicating this.

Line painting will be scheduled according to the weather.

Tom stated a lot of food donations have been coming in. The metal bin has been a big success with the money going towards the food pantry which is bringing in about \$500 to \$600 each month.

A budget workshop will be held on October 27th at 3:00 P.M.

The supervisors will allow the building to be used for a meeting on the Wanguam Falls Bridge with county associates and engineers for their review of proposals. Penn Dot is about 85% complete with a completion date in 2012.

The LVFC is using the Christopherson property for their fire training. The fire company thanked the supervisors for the use of the training. The pond is about three quarters full and is pumping about 2,000 gallons per minute. The board thanked Robert Boogertman for a lot of the work that was done. Suggestions are welcome for the long range plans for the new park area.

At the request of the supervisors, the fire company will issue information to the supervisors concerning fire training on enclosed places. This training is a request from our worker's compensation carrier.

Leigh gave a report on the permits issued for September. An audit report from L&I was issued on the new firehouse. There were some minor mistakes with the microwave in the kitchenette and snack bar height. There was no administration issues reported.

The county convention for elected officials will be held at Lukan's Resort on October 13th beginning at 8:30 A.M.

Leigh Gilbert made a motion for the building to be used for elections on November 4, 2010 seconded by Tom Oakley – vote unanimous.

Tom Oakley reported the salt shed constructed is very secure. He stated that Penn Dot is tearing down 56 sheds at a cost of 31.6 million dollars and will be building wooden structures due to the collapse of two sheds from high winds. The board feels very comfortable with the salt shed that was built by Coverall and there are no plans to have it torn down. The final grant payment was received for this project.

Those present were board members, (Tom, Leigh), Secretary, Solicitor and Vice Chairman Oakley who conducted the meeting which adjourned at 8:11 P.M. Chairman Bruce Chandler was absent from the meeting. Names of those present are herein filed.
