

February 11, 2010

The Paupack Township Board of Supervisors met on the above date at 7:30 P.M. at the Municipal Building. The minutes of the January 14th meeting were presented and approved as written.

A Treasurer's report was presented. A copy is herein filed.

The bills were presented for approval. After reviewing them Tom Oakley made a motion to pay the bills seconded by Leigh Gilbert – vote unanimous.

Tom Oakley made a motion to resign the maps for subdivision 2009-6 Lakeville Fire Station seconded by Leigh Gilbert – vote unanimous.

The food pantry will be open on February 25th from 11:00 until 2:00 P.M.

A meeting was held in the old courtroom in Honesdale concerning the new DEP rules concerning septic systems. Lisa Baker was among the representatives attending.

A new surveillance system has been installed at the township. The system runs 24/7.

The township received the Lakeville Volunteer Fire Company's audit for the years 2007-2008.

The spring clean up will be held on June 5th from 8:00 A.M. until Noon. The announcement will be advertised in the newspaper.

\$800.00 was received for liquor licenses. A check for \$250.04 was received from Solid Waste for the township's portion for recycling.

Bruce Chandler announced that Shepstone Management is now incorporated.

Jim Martin gave an update on the Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance grant. Final payment of \$3,750.00 in grant money will be received soon. This will be the final payment.

A letter from the Dime Bank was received showing secured assets of \$45,094,397.00.

A letter was received from Florence Peoples, tax collector informing the Supervisors that her granddaughter will be assuming her duties while she will be undergoing surgery. The Board stated that there are no provisions in the Second Class Township Code that a deputy tax collector has to be appointed. Mrs. Peoples will be receiving a letter making her aware of this.

Attorney Bugaj filed a judgment against Good Roads for a payment of a plow. This is a 15 year old judgment.

A discussion was held concerning the Planning Commission meeting on a monthly basis. The Board stated that the last three months there has been no activity. The board discussed the possibility of only meeting if there is business to come before the board. This matter was tabled so more research can be done.

A generous donation from Mr. and Mrs. Robert Kiley was received for the food pantry. The Board thanked the Kileys for their donation and thoughtfulness in these tough economic times.

Jim discussed some grant situations with DCED. One was the consideration of a municipal shared grant for a wood chipper with Palmyra Township and Hawley Borough. Jim stated that Palmyra Township and Hawley Borough has agreed to participate in this purchase of a wood chipper.

Those present were board members, (Bruce, Leigh, Tom), Secretary, Solicitor and Chairman Chandler who conducted the meeting which adjourned at 8:04 P.M. Names of those present are herein filed.
